DUTIES	Duties may include: teaching applied lessons, teaching string methods class, performing in the graduate string quartet, or other responsibilities as needed.
COMPENSATION	Annual stipend is \$11,236 and a complete tuition waiver. Tuition scholarships are available for summer terms before and after the period covered by appointments.
QUALIFICATIONS	Completion of an undergraduate degree in music; excellent performance skills; experience with instruction; acceptance into the University.
DEGREES OFFERED	The School of Music awards the Master of Music (M.M.) degree in performance, conducting, music education, music therapy, composition, theory, and music history and literature.
